From the Pastor

I'd like you to think about an observation made by Dr. James Spencer. He wrote that "Christians in the West are being controlled not so much by external forces - but by being lulled into accepting ideas that are counter to God, not by conscious choice but by slow "reorientation of one's beliefs."

Reflect on that for a moment. Is it possible that Biblical Christian faith is being diminished in many quarters slowly but surely through what he calls "reorientation of one's beliefs?"

What does he mean by that? As I was writing this, the word "erosion" comes to mind. Erosion happens slowly at first. Sal and I have a small boat house very close to the shoreline on Alva Lake. It's been there at least since the 1930's. A few years ago Alva Lake's water level rose, slowly at first. It had happened before, so we really didn't think anything of it.

The lake rose higher still, and the wave action continued to eat away at the shoreline until the water was closer to the boat house. A few people around the lake spent a lot of money protecting the shoreline, but lakes naturally go up and down so most of the cabins just waited. We did too. The lake went down a little, but the erosion continued. Left alone without protection the boat house could easily fall into the lake and be ruined.

Go back to that quote that I have at the beginning. A "reorientation of one's beliefs" sounds a lot like erosion to me. It starts slowly and we've seen it before but it's easier to do nothing. Spiritual erosion is the same way.

As we find ourselves at the end of Lent, this is a good time to look at our own spiritual life. Compare the present to twenty years ago. Is your spiritual life

stronger or weaker? Are there telltale signs that there is a "reorientation" of your own faith? Are there ways to protect your faith from the devil's attacks?

We will soon celebrate Holy Week and Easter reminding us that our salvation was won for us on the cross. Protect that gift. Guard it from erosion. It's the most precious thing that you have.

Nikolas Buntrock




