How things have changed. I now listen to music with my Smart Phone and Spotify, and choose the music I want. Technology during our lifetime has been amazing.

One of the blessings of technology is the system that we now use at church to broadcast our services live. We use four cameras installed on the walls, that can be seen on the monitor pictured. These cameras are controlled by Jim Hext or one of his staff. Their process is the same as television studios use. The signal is sent through the internet, where it can be watched live or up to a year later. We normally have between 20 and 45 households viewing the service live. We no longer count those who watch it later. Those who can't be with us in person can still be with us. Technology used correctly, for the right purpose, has been a great blessing.

Having said that, I also hope that this blessing does not become a substitute for those of us who can attend in person. I believe that being together with fellow Christians is still very important.
