From the Pastor

This week I am scheduled for my annual appointment with my medical doctor. It's a time for the doctor to evaluate my general health, and give me whatever recommendations he has. It reminded me that physical health and spiritual health have a lot in common. What follows are some things that come to mind as we approach Lent.

It's tempting to skip the meeting with my doctor. He might have bad news or some recommendation that I don't want to hear. I think Lent falls into that same temptation. We could just wait until Easter and celebrate, rather than listen again to the cost that Jesus paid in order for us to celebrate Easter.

Before my exam, a blood test is taken to measure cholesterol and a number of other indicators. The Lenten season calls for us to do a self-diagnosis of our spiritual health. Scripture lessons, hymns, and sermons will suggest spiritual self-testing. Our natural response is to see such activities as unnecessary.

When I do meet with the doctor, I have the choice to either listen to what he says or simply go through the motions and not change at all. I could selectively listen to the positive and forget the negative. Spiritual health could be easily treated the same way. That would be like my doctor recommending that I take some medicine and then not doing it.

Are you willing to evaluate your spiritual health this year? Are you willing to submit to God's Word even when it calls for change? That's again the challenge that we face. The great thing about such a process is that we can, under the power of the Holy Spirit, make spiritual progress. And the greatest news is that Jesus welcomes those who are "weak and heavy laden". Jesus can heal us.


