From the Pastor

Whenever I walk into the working sacristy to put on my gown, I am amazed by how much technology we use and the number of volunteers involved in broadcasting our services on the internet. The process begins when I prepare the service, and Sal and I choose the hymns for it.

From there, Terri puts the service on the computer and sends it to us for final editing. Sal and I proofread the service, and send any changes to Terri who forwards the service to Devin.



Devin puts it into the format for the PowerPoint presentation that's projected onto the back wall. His power point *slides* are then added to the laptop located near the organ. We presently have 5 volunteers who present the Power Point using that laptop during the services.



There's also a volunteer, Dave Melvin, in the working sacristy. He chooses the live shots and at the same time is on the phone with Jim Hext in Florida. Dave controls how the service is seen and heard on the internet, while Jim is watching it. Dave has the equipment seen in the photo that picks which of the four cameras installed in the sanctuary he wants to use. During the service, he chooses the appropriate camera and he also monitors the sound, which changes depending on whether the voice is coming from a fixed mic on the lectern and pulpit or the pastor's wireless mic.
