From the Pastor

As I write this, Palm Sunday is approaching. I have always been amazed at the various groups that gathered for Palm Sunday to Easter.

On Palm Sunday Jesus is joined by a large crowd as He enters Jerusalem. As I read the account again, it reminds me how easy it was for the crowds that gathered. Many of the "Hosannas" were easily shouted. I think that is where faith started for some in the crowds. It's also true that others were there only casually, and their interest in Jesus soon faded.

Later that week, when the admiring crowd had gone, it got more difficult. As His trial began and then the verdict was shouted, the crowd grew much smaller. As Jesus was led to the crucifixion even fewer dared to follow. The groups that stood near the cross at the crucifixion were a mixed group. Along side the onlookers, the few who loved Jesus were even smaller. Their faith needed to go beyond comprehension. They relied on a faith that clings to trust.

We are represented by all those groups. It is sometimes obvious and even easy to shout when the whole crowd does the same. But there are also times when easy answers elude us, when the questions burn in our hearts but the answers seem far away. May your trust in God cling to a faith that knows, regardless of the path that you are traveling, that Jesus has already been there. And He knows the way.


