# From the Pastor

"Initiating the Question"

Some years ago, when I was at Redeemer in Manitowoc, I traveled briefly to Thailand. While Sal and I didn't stay long, my goal was to identify a Christian mission which our congregation could start. Our group, including our Hmong Deacon, continued the trip to the far northern part of Thailand, an area where our church body had never done any mission work.

At Nan, a city in northern Thailand, our Deacon met with the local Hmong leaders who lived in the jungle far outside the city. When asked what would be most needed by their village, they all agreed that education beyond 6th grade was needed for their children, but not possible. The children would need to be housed safely and fed, in the city where schools were available. Redeemer rented a house, located a trusted Hmong family to live with the children, and we also provided food and school fees for children.

When the arrangements were made, our Deacon met with the village leaders. "Why are you doing this?" the leaders asked. That question opened up the opportunity for our Christian witness. Our Deacon explained to them that we were Christians. Christ's love toward us empowered us to share that love with others.

My point is simply this. Witnessing gains credibility by our actions. Your life in Christ that demonstrates your faith is used by our Holy Spirit to give credibility to your words. The Scripture writer says, "I will show you my faith by what I do."



This student is still in Thailand. Graduated from our Redeemer mission project program in 2005. She continued her education and now graduated from Medical school in Thailand.
