
# ST. MARK COUNCIL NEWS

It is that time of year when the church council is very busy working on the budget for the new year. A lot of work and discussion goes into creating the new budget. Please look the proposed budget over when they are handed out after church and bring your thoughts and/or concerns to the Congregational Meeting scheduled for October 27th right after the service.

The council also creates, reviews and adopts a number of policies for the well-being of the church. These include a Key Policy for managing all of the keys of the church, an Internal Financial Control Policy which sets guidelines as to how the finances of the church are handled, a Service Animal Policy guiding access for service animals at church facilities and events, a Conflict of Interest Policy keeping the highest degree of integrity and honesty consistent with the Scriptures, and more policies that are not listed here. The council encourages all members interested in learning more about our policies to look through them. Policies are available in the binder available in the fellowship area for members to read if they wish.
