We were part of a larger effort that last year supplied 11,927,439 boxes throughout the world. It's amazing to think that the hair brushes and combs that Sal and I bought will end up somewhere in the hands of a child

who might not otherwise have a Christmas present. I hope you share the same joy.



Our congregation has sent other gifts as well. This last year over 400 quilts were sent to someone in need of not only physical but also emotional warmth. Some sewed the quilts together, others transported them to a central location. You supplied the necessary money through our congregation so that the gifts could be stored and then sent somewhere in the world where needed.



You have gifted an untold number of people with the message of the Gospel sent through our livestream. Some are lonely and unable to attend church. Others are perhaps drawn by the Holy Spirit to be a part of our worship through your contributions here at St. Mark.


