From the Pastor

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." Psalm 46

Look again at the verse above. Do you notice the faith expressed there? What does our faith depend on? Someone outside the faith might wonder why we can experience faith even though there is what the Psalmist calls "trouble." If we read further in the Psalm the writer makes it even clearer that our faith is not dependent on God removing the obstacles from our life.

Luther would later express the faith of Psalm 46 in the words of his hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God." God does not remove the obstacles in our life, He overcomes them. The Psalmist admits that "the nations rage, and the Kingdoms totter," a history that continues yet today, our faith is not based on the belief that the world will heal itself and that people will all be at peace with one another. Our faith is based on what the Psalmist declares: "The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress."

Thanksgiving leads us to pause to thank God for all the blessings bestowed upon us, and then transitions to the season of Advent. Advent prepares us to welcome into our hearts again what the Psalmist already proclaimed long ago, "The Lord of hosts," our Savior Jesus Christ, our refuge and our strength.

There were only a few coins in the hat.

A man was walking by. He took a few coins from his pocket and dropped them into the hat. He then took the sign, turned it around, and wrote some words. He put the sign back so that everyone who walked by would see the new words.

Soon the hat began to fill up. A lot more people were giving money to the blind boy. That afternoon the man who had changed the sign came to see how things were.

The boy recognized his footsteps and asked, "Were you the one who changed my sign this morning? What did you write?"

The man said, "I only wrote the truth. I said what you said but in a different way." I wrote: "Today is a beautiful day but I cannot see it."

Both signs told people that the boy was blind. But the first sign simply said the boy was blind. The second sign told people that they were so lucky that they were not blind. Should we be surprised that the second sign was more effective?

Moral of the Story: Be thankful for what you have. Be creative. Be innovative. Think differently and positively. When life gives you a 100 reasons to cry, show life that you have 1000 reasons to smile. Face your past without regret. Handle your present with confidence. Prepare for the future without fear. Keep the faith and drop the fear.

The most beautiful thing is to see a person smiling. And even more beautiful, is knowing that you are the reason behind it!
